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THE FIELD EXERCISE

This is a practice exercise, so don't be concerned if mistakes are made – this is how we learn. This exercise is not the 'real thing', but it will give us a chance to practice what we have learned in class so that many of the procedures and protocols will become 'second nature' when we are called upon to help in a real disaster or emergency. Let's all have fun and learn from this experience.

There are not going to be any surprises or "planned" unexpected events. We are here to practice what we have learned in class, so let's focus on these key elements of being a good emergency responder and communicator.

OBJECTIVES. The objectives of the Field Exercise are:

- To practice Resource Net Control procedures and protocols.
 - Use of the "Resource Station Requirement Log"
 - Use of the "Resource Availability Listing"
 - Use of the " Resource Assignment Log"
 - Checking in with the Resource Net Control Station.
 - Getting an assignment from Resource Net Control.
 - Checking out with Resource NCS when arriving on station.
 - Checking in with Tactical NCS when on station.
- To practice Tactical Net Control procedures and protocols:
 - Use of "tactical" call signs.
 - Use of ham call signs.
 - Listen before PTT.
 - Think about what you want to say before PTT.
 - Use of "common" language.
 - Clear & concise communications.
- To practice proper techniques for informal and formal message handling:
 - Use of the ARES "Tactical Message Log Sheet"
 - Use of the ICS-213 "(Formal) General Message Form"
 - Compose in your mind the msg you want to convey before PTT.
 - Sending the message using the proper tactical net techniques.
 - Logging all your msgs; in & out.
 - Insuring that all msgs that were inquires (questions) received an answer back.

FIELD EXERCISE

SCENARIO "RAINY VALLEY":

It has been raining steadily over the watershed of the San Lorenzo Valley and the rest of Santa Cruz County with rain fall rates in excess of 1/2" per hour for most of the last three (3) days. As the rain continues, roads are starting to become blocked and water levels are getting extremely high in all of the creeks and the San Lorenzo River. The power is off in most of the San Lorenzo Valley.

The Santa Cruz County EOC and the Santa Cruz Red Cross are activated. The San Lorenzo EOC has been established at Felton CDF.

The Tactical Net Control Station call is "SAN LORENZO EOC".

Working Frequency: W6WLS/r, 147.18 (+) PL 94.8

Tactical and Resource Nets will be run concurrently on the same frequency.

For purposes of this exercise, the following Station Assignments have been made:

BEGINNING OF THE EXERCISE – RAINY VALLEY

Announcement to be made by the Shift Supervisor over the radio to begin the exercise:

"THIS IS A PRACTICE EXERCISE.

"This is the Field Exercise that is Part 5 of the ARES Training Sessions. The purpose of this Field Exercise is to practice the procedures and protocols learned as part of the Training program.

"This Field Exercise is a requirement for completion of the Training Sessions. Visitors are welcome to participate but they will be assigned after class participants have been given their assignments and as positions or stations are available.

"Scenario: It has been raining steadily over the watershed of the San Lorenzo Valley and the rest of Santa Cruz County with rain fall rates in excess of ½" per hour for most of the last three (3) days. As the rain continues, roads are starting to become blocked and water levels are getting extremely high in all of the creeks and the San Lorenzo River. The power is off in most of the San Lorenzo Valley.

"The Santa Cruz County EOC and the Santa Cruz Red Cross have been activated. The San Lorenzo EOC has been established at Felton CDF.

"Resource Net and Tactical Net for this exercise are Directed Nets. If you have emergency battery power, please use it for this exercise.

[At this point:

- *The Shift Supervisor calls the Resource Net Control Station.*
- *The Shift Supervisor makes a new station request for the "Mountain Resource Center in Ben Lomond" by giving the information req'd on the "Resource Station Requirement Log Sheet."*
- *Following the request for the new station (Mountain Resource Center), the Shift Supervisor turns the 'net' over to the Resource Net Control Station so that they can begin taking check-ins.]*

"I now turn the Training Exercise over to the Resource Net Control Station to begin taking volunteer check ins." de Shift Supervisor [call sign]"

RESOURCE NET CONTROL

"THIS IS A PRACTICE EXERCISE.

"This is Resource Net Control Station _____ .

"Assignments will be given at the end of check in. Due to time constraints, volunteers are requested to simulate the travel to and their actual assigned location or station. No station or assignment details will be given as part of the assignments from Resource Net Control. For this exercise assume all appropriate information about the Tactical Assignment has been given.

"I will take Check-ins first, then I will call you back with your assignment. Once given your assignment, you can assume that you have been "checked out" with Resource Net Control.

For purposes of expediency, Tactical Net Control will do a roll call of all assigned stations and assignments prior to the beginning of the Tactical Net portion of this exercise.

"This is Resource Net Control Station _____ requesting check-ins for the "Rainy Valley" flood event. We will take Training Class participants volunteers first. Please check in now:"

Note:

- *[RNCS should be filling out the 3 Resource Net Forms.]*
- *After taking all check-ins, call the volunteers back with their specific assignments.*

[GIVE ASSIGNMENTS TO ALL CHECK-INS (class participants have first priority for assignments).]

"This is Resource Net Control Station _____ turning the exercise over to Tactical Net Control."

- *After all assignments have been made, turn the frequency over to Tactical Net Control.*

Instructions to Field Exercise participants:

1. Following is a script for most all the tactical messages for the Tactical Net. Please follow the script, in order, noting the comments between [] for additional information or instructions.
2. Listen carefully, non-assigned Tactical Locations will be skipped and the script will continue with additional messages as time allows, as appropriate.
 - Use the 2 different message forms (Tactical Message Log Sheet and ICS-213 General Message Form), for this exercise.
 - All "Informal" messages, both to and from your Tactical location, must be logged on the "Tactical Message Log Sheet.
3. "Formal" messages will be will be logged on the "ICS-213 General Message Form". Formal messages must be copied word-for-word and must contain the name and title of the person to whom the message is being sent to and the name and title of the person originating the message. *Alert: Be prepared! Everyone will receive at least 1 Formal Message.*
4. Each Tactical Station is responsible for sending at least one and possibly two (2) "informal" tactical messages to another tactical station. The "subject content" of the message that you are to communicate to another tactical station is given below. It is your responsibility to format the message properly to convey the precise meaning in the least number of words. This is to be done before PTT!
5. Please observe the proper tactical net protocol and the use of Tactical and ham call signs. For example, one of the scripts on the following page reads:

"Redwood Shelter, Santa Cruz Red Cross, Ask for 30 more cots and 60 more blankets."

You as the communicator at "Redwood Shelter" have been asked by the shelter manager to obtain from "Santa Cruz Red Cross" 30 more cots and 60 more blankets. Therefore, you would create the following message and communicate it as required. An example of the message you might create is:

- San Lorenzo EOC, Redwood Shelter, Directed call (to) Santa Cruz Red Cross
- San Lorenzo EOC: Go ahead (with your traffic)
- Santa Cruz Red Cross, Redwood Shelter
- Santa Cruz Red Cross, what's your traffic
- Need additional 30 Cots, 60 Blankets; de Redwood Shelter, [FCC Call-sign]
- Copy, will get back to you with an ETA; de Santa Cruz Red Cross, [FCC Call-sign]

TACTICAL NET CONTROL:

"THIS IS A PRACTICE EXERCISE.

"This is Tactical Net Control Station _____ .

"Scenario update: It has been raining steadily over the watershed of the San Lorenzo Valley and the rest of Santa Cruz County with rain fall rates in excess of 1/2" per hour for most of the last three (3) days. As the rain continues, roads are starting to become blocked and water levels are getting extremely high in all of the creeks and the San Lorenzo River. The power is off in most of the San Lorenzo Valley.

"The Santa Cruz County EOC and the Santa Cruz Red Cross have been activated. The San Lorenzo EOC has been established at Felton CDF.

"There will now be a roll call of all deployed tactical stations: [TNCS do a roll call].

"We now join the exercise in progress and that each station follow the script as shown below, beginning with the County EOC requesting a status report from the San Lorenzo EOC...
